TASK

The task of the FIMM Project on Education is to develop and implement educational programs that will support the basic curriculum of 300 hours training in Manual/Musculoskeletal Medicine.

The period of development shall start in 2018 and end in 2023.



The FIMM program checklist aims the comparison of any education program with the FIMM Guidelines on basic training and safety, version 3.1 (2013). We have created a table variant of the guidelines which is much easier to be filled and also allowing an easier further comparison and evaluation.



FIMM EdB Task forces 2021:

 In Elche three new task forces have been formed for the endorsement of the education programs of Germany, Switzerland and the Czech Republic with a mandate of 6 months:

In the beginning of 2021 has become obvious to the Board the serious difficulty in matching the current FIMM Guidelines with the programs of some of the societies, especially the non - European ones.
